

Veterans Affairs Committee Information

The Brittany Pointe Veterans Affairs Committee (BPVAC) was established in 2002 to recognize and honor military veterans who served to defend and preserve the sovereignty the United States, our freedoms and way of life.

This committee established and maintains the Wall of Honor. This display includes an engraved brass plate for each veteran with their name, branch and dates of service; a description of each veteran's record of service; and when available a photo of the veteran taken during their time in service. Deceased veterans are designated with a gold star on their photograph and on their record of service. The Wall of Honor is located in the hallway to the right of the main entrance lobby of Brittany Pointe.

The BPVAC also conducts ceremonies to honor veterans on one or more holidays during the year, such as Veterans Day, Armed Forces Day, etc.
